

Hazard Containment Room Supplies

1. Containment Room Entry Procedure Sign on the exterior door as well as the cubicle door(s)
2. Appropriate PPE stocked outside room (except eye protection which is stocked inside the room)
 - a. Cleaning wipes for eye protection
3. Pink barcode stickers and pink highlighter
4. Washable marker
5. Binder containing chemical and biological labels for cage cards and/or carcasses
6. Chemical and biological labels (dissolvable) for cage bottoms
7. Yellow acetates for non-hazardous animals
8. Biological safety cabinet (BSC) certified annually by EHS
9. Dip box with forceps (for mouse rooms)
10. Bleach and/or Clidox and Spor Klenz
11. Paper towel
12. Containment binder that includes:
 - a. Binder cover page
 - b. Animals Administered a Hazardous Substance Requiring Containment SOP
 - c. Biological and/or chemical substance forms specific to each protocol
 - d. Pathogen Safety Data Sheet (PSDS) (found in Containment SOP)
 - e. SDS locator sign (link in Containment SOP to the EHS website)
 - f. EHS Universal Precaution Sheet (link in Containment SOP to the EHS website)
 - g. Documenting, Disposal, and Reporting Animal Deaths SOP
 - h. Procedures for Loose Mice and Rats SOP
 - i. Maximum Housing Densities for Mouse and Rat Cages SOP
 - j. Environmental Hazards Administered in Food and Water in Standard Rodent Housing Rooms SOP
13. Incident and Near Miss sign posted in a visible location (found on Dropbox)
14. Autoclave tape
15. Rubber bands and/or tape (At least one is required)
16. Secondary transport containers with absorbent material, available upon request
17. Clean cages to transport animals or change cages
18. Clear trash bags to cover dirty cages
19. Separate water bottle baskets inside cloth laundry bags (green for chemical, orange for biological) on the floor for bottles from chemical and biological cages
20. Scraper to remove dirty bedding from chemical cages
21. Low profile MI tops
22. Waste container to collect hazardous waste water, only if being used in the containment room
23. Autoclavable bags and/or brown refuse bags for packing items that need to be autoclaved
24. Chemical and biological trash bins with reusable lids and the appropriate labels
25. Separate Sharps containers with rotor lids for chemical and biological sharps, labeled with the accumulation start date.
 - a. Chemical Sharps containers are labeled with chemical hazard sticker and a hazardous waste label
26. Euthanasia station for use within the BSC and euthanasia station instructions
 - a. If a euthanasia station cannot be placed in the housing room, post a sign directing personnel to where euthanasia must occur.
27. Hand sanitizer and/or hand soap
