AT – Avulsion: Separation of tooth from alveolus

CA – Carious Lesion: Also called a cavity. Crater-like lesions, feel soft when probed.

C - Calculus:

- C/sl Calculus slight
- C/mod Calculus moderate
- C/h Calculus heavy

F – Furcation Exposure

- F1 Explorer can enter the furcation but does not exit the other side.
- **F2** Explorer enters and exits through other side.

FX – Fractured Tooth

- **FX1** Enamel fractured with dentin exposed.
- **FX2** Dentin and pulp exposure.

G – Gingivitis

- **G1** Mild.
- G2 Erythema, bleeding on probing.
- **G3** Severe erythema, swelling, bleeding on probing.

GR – Gum Recession: Areas where the gingival margin is below the cemento-enamel junction.

O – Missing Tooth

ONF – **Oronasal Fistula:** An abnormal communication between the mouth and the nasal cavity.

P – Pulpotomy: Typically performed when disarming canine teeth.

PP - Periodontal Pocket

RT – Root Canal Therapy

R/A - Restoration-Amalgam

R/C - Restoration-Composite

W – Worn Tooth
